Students transferring from Umpqua Community College (UCC) in an Associate of Applied Science program to Southern Oregon University's (SOU) Bachelor of Applied Science in Management program will be given full credit for all selected courses listed below. This agreement is based on the evaluation of the rigor and content of the general education and technical courses at both UCC and SOU. This agreement is dated <u>June 4</u>, 2010 and will be updated on an annual basis or as needed.

Baccalaureate students must complete a minimum of 60 credits of upper-division work before a degree will be awarded at SOU. Upper-division is defined as 300-and 400-level classes at a bachelor's degree granting institution.

To become admitted to the BAS program, students must hold an AAS degree outside the area of business or accounting with a GPA of 2.5 or better.

SOU program requirements specified in this agreement shall apply when the student is admitted to SOU. Students must enroll at SOU within three years of completing their AAS program at UCC.

About the Program

The eligible AAS in a career technical field and management has been developed with the cooperation and support of Southern Oregon University (SOU). The AAS is fully articulated with SOU's Bachelor of Applied Science in Management program and allows students to transfer and become admitted into the School of Business at Southern Oregon University to pursue a bachelor's degree. The program offers an excellent balance of career technical coursework, business coursework, and general education courses that support advanced study in Management.

Students should contact a counselor at UCC or the SOU School of Business early in the first year of their AAS program to be advised about additional requirements and procedures for admission to the school or program. Students should be aware of the admission requirements at SOU, including the minimum cumulative GPA requirement of 2.5 in their AAS program.

Students should be aware that if they transfer before completing their AAS degree, they will not be eligible for the BAS program and their courses will be evaluated individually toward the general education requirements and School of Business requirements in effect at SOU.

Entry Requirements

Students who have not satisfied the Math and English general education requirements must take the college placement test to determine skill level and readiness indicated by test scores. As part of their training program, students must begin with the courses within their skill levels as determined by placement test scores. In addition, students may be required to enroll in classes that would increase their employability and success. Math and English requirements are met through the courses listed on Page 3 of this agreement.

Students who have graduated from high school or completed a high school equivalency program in 1997 or after must have the following requirement for admission to a four-year Oregon state college or university: 1) Two years of the same high school-level language, or 2) two terms of college-level language with a grade of "C-" or better.

Advanced Standing

Coursework from accredited colleges and universities will be accepted in accordance with college policies and the approval of the Dean of the School of Business. To ensure coursework is current, program course credits over 10 years old may be reviewed and approved by the appropriate department head before being accepted toward course requirements.

Graduation Requirements

Students must complete a minimum of 180 quarter credits to earn a bachelor's degree at SOU. Students must earn C- or better in Written & Oral Communication General Education courses. For additional degree requirements, visit the SOU School of Business website listed below, and consult with an academic advisor.

The number of career technical credits applicable to this program will depend upon the number of credits a student transfers to satisfy the general education requirements. SOU's Bachelor of Applied Science in Management degree requires 180 total credits. Students completing both the AAS and BAS degrees may accumulate more than 180 credits.
- 2. SOU requires three social science classes from an approved list. Econ201 and Econ202 are required for the BAS program. The third class recommended is Psy101 or BA101.
- 3. SOU requires three humanities classes from an approved list of courses. Students may find the list of approved courses on the General Education Transfer Guide here. Or visit: www.sou.edu/admissions/transfer and select "General Education Transfer Guides."
- 4. SOU requires three sciences classes from an approved list. Two of those courses must have a lab. Students may find the list of approved courses on the General Education Transfer Guide here. Or visit: www.sou.edu/admissions/transfer and select "General Education Transfer Guides."
- 5. Baccalaureate students must complete a minimum of 60 credits of upper-division work before a degree will be awarded. Upper-division is defined as 300- and 400- level classes at a bachelor's degree granting institution.
- 6. SOU requires students to take three upper division courses as part of the Universities Studies. They are referred to as the Integration Strands H, I and J. Courses approved for the Integration Strands may be found at: http://www.sou.edu/access/acadvising.
