It is agreed that students transferring from Klamath Community College (KCC) to Southern Oregon University's (SOU) Bachelor of Science degree in Criminology and Criminal Justice will be given full credit for all selected courses listed on the attached schedule. Students following this program of study will have met SOU's lower-division general education requirements and will be assured junior standing as pre-criminology majors at SOU. Students will be eligible for full admission to the Criminology and Criminal Justice program at SOU after completion of the following courses: CCJ 298 (Orientation to Criminology and Criminal Justice at SOU) with a "pass" and CCJ 300 (Essentials of Criminal Justice Research and Writing) with a grade of B- or higher.

This agreement is based on the evaluation of the rigor and content of the general education and technical courses at both KCC and SOU. This agreement is subject to a yearly reevaluation by both schools. This agreement shall remain in effect until revised or terminated by KCC or SOU.

Baccalaureate students must complete a minimum of 60 credits of upper division work before a degree will be awarded and meet all the requirements of SOU prior to graduation. Upper division is defined as 300- and 400-level classes at a bachelor's degree-granting institution.

Transfer students may guarantee their catalog of graduation by obtaining written approval from their SOU major department. The agreed upon catalog will be the one a student uses when he/she declares the AAS degree major at Klamath Community College. Students must enroll at SOU within two years of this approval.

About the Program: The Associate of Applied Science degree in Criminal Justice has been developed with the cooperation and support of Southern Oregon University (SOU). Students following this program of study will have met SOU's lower-division general education requirements and will be assured junior standing as pre-criminology majors at SOU. Students will be eligible for full admission to the Criminology and Criminal Justice program at SOU after completion of the following courses: CCJ 298 with a "pass" and CCJ 300 with a grade of B- or higher. The program offers an excellent balance of criminology, criminal justice and general education courses that support advanced study in the field of Criminology and/or Criminal Justice

Students should contact the SOU Department of Criminology and Criminal Justice early in the first year of their Associate of Applied Science program to be advised about additional requirements and procedures for admission to the school or program.

Students should be aware that if they transfer before completing this degree, their courses will be evaluated individually toward the general education requirements in effect at SOU.

**Entry Requirements:** Klamath Community College students are required to take the college placement test to determine skill level and readiness indicated by test scores. As part of their training program, students must begin with the courses within their skill levels as determined by placement test scores. In addition, students may also be required to enroll in classes that would increase their employability and success.

Advanced Standing: Coursework from accredited colleges and universities will be accepted in accordance with college policies and the Criminology and Criminal Justice Department head's approval. In order to ensure coursework is current, program courses over 10 years old must be reviewed and approved by the appropriate department head before being accepted toward course requirements.

**Graduation Requirements:** The Associate of Applied Science degree will be awarded to students who complete all credits in this program with a grade of "C" or better. Certain required courses are graded on a pass/no pass basis only. A grade of "P" for these courses indicates a student earned a "C" or better grade.
