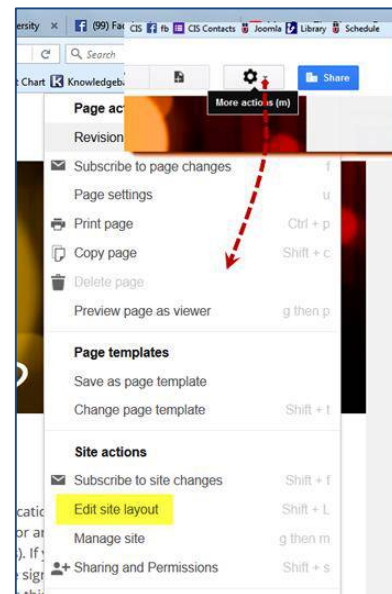
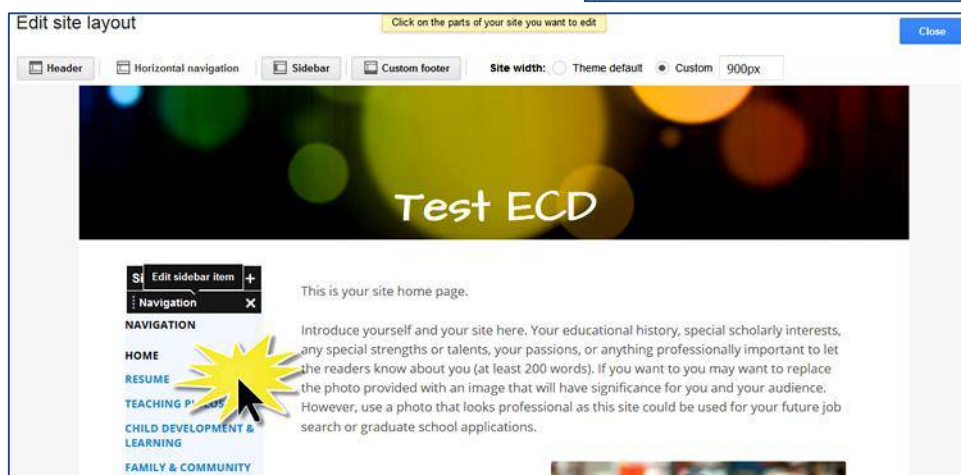


If you add a page to a Google site, you'll want to have it appear in your site's navigation menu. To add it to your existing list of page links:

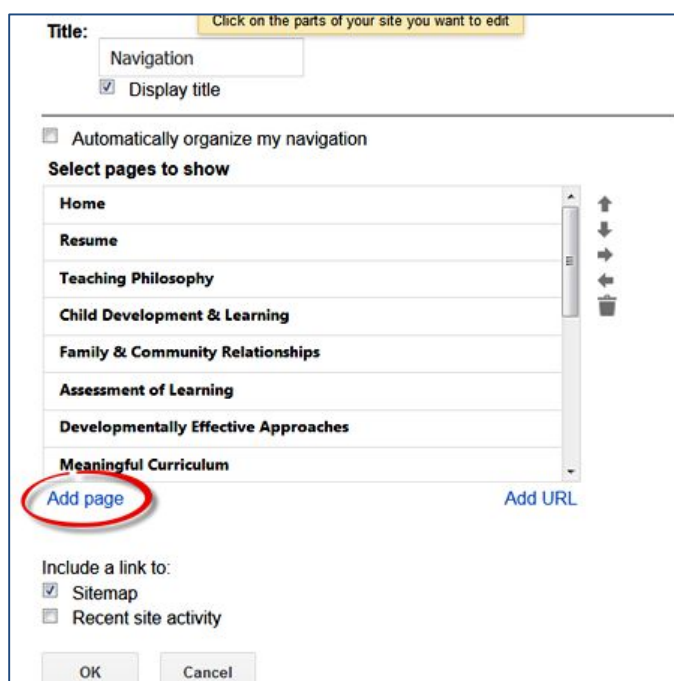
1. Click on the **More actions** icon in the upper right corner of your site to bring up the options list shown here.
2. Click on **Edit site layout**.



3. In the **Edit site layout** page, click in the **Navigation** area (your navigation links may be horizontal instead of vertical, but this process is the same).



4. You'll see the pages that already appear in your navigation list in the **Select pages to show** dialogue box. Click on **Add page** below the list of displayed pages.



Add a Page to Navigation

- Click on the name of the page that you wish to add to the navigation list.
- Click on **OK** to add the page to the list.
- Locate the new page that you have added to the list (you may need to scroll down to it, if your site has several pages).
- Select the page (if it is no longer highlighted) and click on the **Up arrow** to move the page into its desired position in the list. To show that a page is a subpage (like *Effective Communication* is in this example), use the **Indent arrow** to move it into a subsidiary position.
- Click on **OK** after positioning the page where you want it to be.
- Click on **Close** in the upper right corner to save your changes to the navigation list and return to editing your site.
