History of OLLI at SOU

Number the following events from 1 to 10 in chronological order.

- ___ OLLI moves to online registration for courses.
- ___ The first printed catalog replaces the stapled dittoed lists of courses.
- ___ The members vote to change the name of Southern Oregon Learning in Retirement (SOLIR) to OLLI at SOU; two years later the organization receives the first million-dollar grant from OSHER.
- ___ SOU provides one room in the former married student housing building, later named the Campbell Center, for classes. 147 members pay \$75 for the year; the first term consists of 9 courses.
- ___ All classes are moved to other locations in Ashland and Medford while major renovations are made to the Campbell Campus, including new chairs and wide TVs instead of pull-down movie screens. (And Keurig coffee makers instead of hot water and packets of Instant.)
- ___ Classes are offered at the Manor in Medford for the first time.
- ___ The first term in which both in-person and online courses are offered.
- ___ Membership in the organization reaches 1,000.
- ___ The first courses are held at HEC (Higher Education Center) in Medford.
- ___ After 95 volunteer instructors agree to learn how to teach on Zoom, the organization presents over 100 courses online for the first time.
