PHL 207

The Philosophy of Sport, 4 credits

This course is intended as an opportunity to examine “sport” at a deeper, conceptual level while also serving as an exciting, topics-based, introduction to philosophical concepts and methods.

NAS 440

American Indian Identities, 4 credits

Provides a multidisciplinary perspective on American Indian identities today, including the question of who or what even counts as "Indian," and why. Topics include historical and contemporary perspectives from political, ethnic, cultural, and legal standpoints, both from within indigenous communities and in wider society. Upper division standing required. Approved for University Studies Integration (Strand J).

TA 458

Topics in Drama, 4 Credits

This course will examine the dramatic literature of two of America’s most influential playwrights: Eugene O’Neill and Tennessee Williams. The coursework will include: an examination of major works, biographical aspects of their work, cultural considerations, production concerns and contemporary considerations.
