1. What are the primary duties of this committee?

1.233 (m) University Studies Committee

Charge from the Bylaws:

The University Studies Committee (USC) will oversee the institution, maintenance and development of the University Studies general education curriculum.

The USC will be composed of seven voting faculty members, one representing each of the following: the School of Arts and Letters, the School of Business, the School of Education, the School of Sciences, the School of Social Sciences, Health and Physical Education, the University Seminar program, and the Library. The chair of the committee will be elected from the voting membership of the committee. (needs updating on the Website)

Until the end of the 2005-2006 academic year, up to four additional faculty members who served as full-time faculty members of CREAC, will be invited to serve as voting members of the USC. The Associate Provost for Curriculum and Personnel, the Assistant Vice President for Enrollment Services and Director of Admissions, the Director of the Center for Teaching, Learning and Assessment (CTLA), one member of the ACCESS center advising staff, a representative from Information Technology (IT), and one student will also serve as ex-officio, non-voting members. The Provost will designate one of the administrative ex-officio members as the administrative contact for this committee.

- a. Charge: The University Studies Committee shall oversee the institution, maintenance, and development of the University Studies (general education) curriculum. Specifically, the Committee will:
 - Review and recommend modifications, as needed, to the general education program, including the associated goals and proficiencies.
 - Develop and maintain criteria for courses meeting specific goals.
 - Review and recommend new courses to Faculty Senate through the Undergraduate Curriculum Committee that will meet University Studies criteria.
 - Develop and maintain a systematic process for reviewing existing courses that are approved for University Studies at least once every five years to assure they continue to meet current criteria.
 - Recommend policy changes or additions needed to support general education at Southern Oregon University.
 - Assist faculty or staff responsible for evaluating transfer courses.
 - Work with the Institutional Assessment Committee regarding the effectiveness of the general education component of Southern Oregon University's undergraduate degrees.

2. What did you plan to accomplish this year?

- Work with faculty development on the House Curriculum and University Studies
- Discuss and assisted with House Building efforts and Faculty Senate approval
- Recommended Sub-Committee for review of HOUSE templates, Honors Templates and BS requirements.
- Increase communication with other committees involved with curriculum and assessment

- in areas such as rubrics to establish the validity and value of the program as key to career and success (and TracData assessment). This has been on an ongoing effort!
- Create a stronger presence of Foundational Goals in exploration and integration courses through template review.
- Worked with academic advising needs for substitution and University Studies petitions.
- Change faculty, student, and staff perception from "checking the boxes" for general education to the overall value of SOU's liberal arts focus, especially as related to revamping towards new delivery (of teaching) using outcomes---on going.

Subcommittee for Undergraduate Studies

The Subcommittee for Undergraduate Studies is responsible for reviewing all courses that are submitted under the Faculty Senate approved template (shell). These include Honors, Houses, USem, and Bachelor of Science courses. The Committee will be establishing the assessment

process for the University Studies Strand courses and with the approval of the Assessment Committee, University Studies Committee, and Faculty Senate. The Subcommittee will be establishing rubrics strand-level University Studies curriculum assessment. Specifically, this Sub-Committee undertakes the following activities:

*Conducts a comprehensive review of the courses submitted for approval under an approved Faculty Senate template model,

*Develops and works with the Assessment & University Studies Committees to create the rubrics used to conduct the assessment of competencies for the nine strand areas identified in the University Studies Curriculum (Strand A-J) and,

*Reviews courses submitted for BS designation.
