1. What are the primary duties of this committee?

1.233 (m) University Studies Committee

Charge from the Bylaws:

The University Studies Committee (USC) will oversee the institution, maintenance and development of the University Studies general education curriculum.

The USC will be composed of seven voting faculty members, one representing each of the following: the School of Arts and Letters, the School of Business, the School of Education, the School of Sciences, the School of Social Sciences, Health and Physical Education, the University Seminar program, and the Library. The chair of the committee will be elected from the voting membership of the committee. (* updating on the Website see: https://www.sou.edu/Senate/committees/universitystudies.html).

Suggest:

The USC will be composed of faculty members, one representing each of the following divisions: Oregon Center for the Arts; Business Communication & The Environment; Education, Health, & Leadership; Humanities & Culture; Social Sciences; Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics, the Library, and Undergraduate Studies. The chair of the committee will be elected from the voting membership of the committee. Non-Voting members: Associate Provost, Division Director UGS, Advising Staff, ESC representative, and student member.

Until the end of the 2005-2006 academic year, up to four additional faculty members who served as full-time faculty members of CREAC, will be invited to serve as voting members of the USC. The Associate Provost for Curriculum and Personnel, the Assistant Vice President for Enrollment Services and Director of Admissions, the Director of the Center for Teaching, Learning and Assessment (CTLA), one member of the ACCESS center advising staff, a representative from Information Technology (IT), and one student will also serve as ex-officio, non-voting members. The Provost will designate one of the administrative ex-officio members as the administrative contact for this committee.

- a. Charge: The University Studies Committee shall oversee the institution, maintenance, and development of the University Studies (general education) curriculum. Specifically, the Committee will:
 - Review and recommend modifications, as needed, to the general education program, including the associated goals and proficiencies.
 - Develop and maintain criteria for courses meeting specific goals.
 - Review and recommend new courses to Faculty Senate through the Undergraduate Curriculum Committee that will meet University Studies criteria.
 - Develop and maintain a systematic process for reviewing existing courses that are approved for University Studies at least once every five years to assure they continue to meet current criteria.
 - Recommend policy changes or additions needed to support general education at Southern Oregon University.

- Assist faculty or staff responsible for evaluating transfer courses.
- Work with the Institutional Assessment Committee regarding the effectiveness of the general education component of Southern Oregon University's undergraduate degrees.

2. What did you plan to accomplish this year?

- Discuss the University Studies Template for course approval all strands
- Create a stronger presence of Foundational Goals in exploration and integration courses through template review and clearer language requirements (carried over from 2013-2014).
- Discuss alignment with institutional assessment for University Studies Accreditation reporting efforts.
- Worked with academic advising needs for substitution and University Studies petitions.
- Continued a conversation with faculty, student, and staff regarding the perception of University Studies: overall value of SOU's liberal arts focus, especially as related to teaching outcomes (on going).

- The committee started in late fall and nominated and voted in Brian Stonelake to serve as chair. Brian has agreed to remain chair for the 2015-2016 year.

- Work with subcommittee to develop rubric for first assessment of HSE exploration courses
- Alignment with University Assessment Committee
- Focus on Assessment conversation as we approach Accreditation
- TracDat alignment for assessment with University Studies and Institutional Assessment
- Continue to make sure all strand courses have templates on file with approval from UStudies Committee
- Work closely with faculty who are developing UStudies course work
- An extensive look at the integrations courses is recommended. Courses with several prerequisites or that are exclusive to a major (such as capstone) need a second look. As
 assessments for the integration courses are developed, making sure that students have a
 pathway to complete integrations courses in imperative.
