(4 pts.-2 pt. bolds, 2 pts. Answer)

2. This structure is about 15 miles from KFS, 61 miles from DUN, and 51 miles from MFR. When was it deactivated? (D, M, Y) (3 pts)

Answer: 30 September 1979

3. A large energy concern sponsored a marathon to see how efficient an internal combustion engine could be made to power a vehicle. The photo is of a 2018 entrant. To the nearest tenth, how many miles per gallon did this vehicle get? 3 pts.

Answer: 1294.8 mpg

4. The Chief Justice wanted to instill comradery among his fellow justices, so he arranged for them to eat together. Story Story told was that the Chief Justice **promulgated a rule to guide their mutual dining**. Declining to whine about the issue, even as a man not known to outgrow his early prejudices, what was the Chief Justice's response to the rule on a clement day? 3 pts. (1 pt. bold, 2 pts. Correct answer)

5. It is first recorded, as we recognize it, around 7BC, yet continues to influence modern actions, scholarship, and entertainment. Historical documentation is somewhat jumbled, but **bombardment with by a slipper** figures prominently. It has been classified as **subset 510A** in a renowned categorization of the genre. In what Oregon high school did one of the classifiers teach? 4 pts. (2 for bolds , 2 for answer)

7. Legend has it the location was settled by adventurers who started out looking for green land, but **settled because they were green around the gills**. Fermented food, called ræst, adds the distinctive flavor of mold to the local cuisine. A dinner at the most highly rated restaurant at the location **costs about \$220 per person** (with a wine pairing, add \$170). Using an eponymous name, the chef flirts with traditional dishes, such as a sandwich of salted gannet and blubber with slivers of dried cod skin combined with herbs from a nearby mountainside. At this starred restaurant, what is the maximum number of diners that can be served in a night? 4pts. (2-bold, 2- correct)

One installment of book ended with a doting mother swooning over the son she compared to Hamlet, the son being struck violently by the son of his mother's valet, a man exiled from his patroness' house after a two decade dependence, and a young heiress fainting. There was no punishment meted out for the crime, brothers were involved, and one of the characters was possibly an idiot. All involved struggled with internal demons. What is the name of the narrator? (Use the Latinized version of his name and make sure to spell out the complete last name for full credit) (F, M, L) (4 pts.-1 pt. bold, 3 pts. correct answer)

(2-bold, 4-correct answer)

Even though the precipitation and generally wet conditions of the Coast Range tend to resist fire more than the Cascades, the increased fuel loads in the Coast Range mean “**but when it goes, it really goes.**” In an Oregon State University **dendrochronological** study of thousands of stumps, what was the conclusion about how many years are we overdue for a cataclysmic burn in the Coast Range? 5 pts. (2-bold, 3 correct answer)

13. **Yehudi Menuhin was a no show** for the Mendelsohn, so a last minute substitute soloist was found to play the Grieg Piano Concerto. Privet, or maybe it was **Preview, was the conductor**. (He is Woody Allen’s father-in-law.) On the first reading, it was decided the introduction was not long enough. About how much too short was it? You may use YouTube as a source. 6 pts. (2-bold, 4 pts.-correct answer)
